PIANC Australia Working Groups

The Board of PIANC Australia meets 4 times per year. Four working groups report to the Board as follows:-

➤ Membership and Communications (Chair –Stuart Bettington)

The Membership and Communications Working Group has seen striving to increase membership in tough times through a combination of increasing value for existing members and a focussed membership drive.

The biennial Coasts and Ports Conference was held in Auckland in 2015, providing an opportunity for PIANC Australia to present PIANC to the waterway professionals of New Zealand.

Australia and the impact of this membership drive is expected to be seen in 2016 memberships.

The value to members was seen through a range of technical and social events that allowed members and potential members to see the network of professionals that PIANC includes.

A series of workshops titled 'Sustainable Dredging and Sediment Management: Assessing and Managing Environmental Effects and Benefits' run by Todd Bridges were conducted in Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne and Perth, in collaboration with Engineers Australia were particularly well received (see image below).



A number of technical workshops were held in Sydney and Perth in collaboration with the Engineers Australia.

➤ Outreach (Scott Keane)

One of the key objectives of the Outreach Group was the Coasts & Ports Conference which in 2015 was held in Auckland with PIANC Australia participating in the organising committee and providing the Keynote Speaker (Todd Bridges).

The Outreach Working Group has been looking to work closely with PIANC Commission WG representatives in preparing Australian technical programs focussed on the application of newly released WG Guidelines. In 2015 some workshops that had been planned needed to be rescheduled due to difficulty in obtaining information from the WG Committees. For 2016 there is a new program being planned with presentations and workshops

in most capital cities, with Australian PIANC members generally presenting material released by PIANC WGs and based on local case studies. Many of these events are being planned in cooperation with YP activities.

PIANC Australia, through the Outreach Committee, remains a strong supporter of the Pacific Islands through our collaboration with the Pacific Maritime Transport Alliance (PMTA). In 2015 Scott Keane attended the PMTA Conference, held in Papua New Guinea.



For 2016 the Outreach Committee is working closely with Ron Cox and CoCom to hold an event tailored to Pacific member Port representatives and to be held in Fiji where PMTA has Secretariat support.

➤ Young Professionals (William Glamore)

Australia's Young Professional (YP) Working Group is a vital part of PIANC's future. In 2016, PIANC YP Australia is moving into its third year. The group is chaired by Dr William Glamore, with PIANC Board members Dr Kate Panayotou and Mr Tim Green nominated delegates and actively involved.

Overall, the YP group aims to:

- Provide networking and mentoring forums for young professionals across Australia
- Promote and encourage young professionals to contribute to PIANC publications/WGs
- Play a key role in PIANC YP Asia

- Provide an opportunity for PIANC YP awards
- Liaise with PIANC's YP International
- Organise meetings and promote knowledge transfer amongst young professionals in Australia and globally.

There are currently over 63 registered Young Professionals in Australia, with YP membership rapidly growing.

In 2015 the PIANC YP award was announced at the Coast and Ports Conference (Auckland) and presented to Shaun Denehy (Paper Title: Restricted water effects on berthed ship - passing ship interaction).



At the same conference a successful YP networking event was held with over 50 people attending.

YP Australia was represented at the YPCom International meetings in Brussels (including the 5th BTV) and in Buenos Aires. We are actively involved in international events through Will's role as Co-Chair of YP-Com. Locally, we hosted the inaugural YP Australia Committee meeting.

A sundowner for YP's was also held in Perth in March 2015 and this was a well-attended event promoting the activities of PIANC.

Proposed activities in 2016 include assisting in the development of the 2nd PIANC Asian YP-Com meeting to be held in Manila in April 2016, running networking events across Australia, developing national chapters, liaising with PIANC International, assigning YP nominees to international PIANC Working Groups, promoting award submissions, and distributing technical information for our industry.

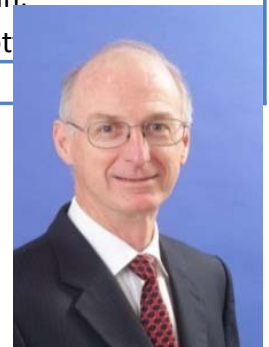
