WHAT IS PIANC?

The World Association for Waterborne Transport Infrastructure.

Bringing together experts on technical, economic, environmental and planning issues pertaining to waterborne transport infrastructure.

PIANC is the forum where professionals around the world join forces to provide expert guidance on cost-effective, reliable and sustainable infrastructure to facilitate waterborne transport.

PIANC (which historically stood for the Permanent International Association of Navigational Congresses) began in 1885 – one of the first international technical organisations, committed to regular global gatherings of experts to share knowledge and expertise.

A non-political and non-profit organisation, PIANC continues to be the leading partner for government and the private sector in the design, development and maintenance of ports, waterways and coastal areas. Members include national governments and public authorities, corporations and interested individuals.

At the core of PIANC's mission is the publication of high-quality Technical Reports realised by international Working Groups. PIANC Working Groups are composed of participants from multiple member countries who have expertise in the issue being investigated. The groups gather, analyse, and consolidate international, state-of-the-art, best practice material to provide evidence-based guidance.

PIANC's other key pursuit is the organisation of international and regional conferences, such as the four-yearly PIANC World Conference, last held in Panama City in 2018. After two years of Covid disruptions, the 35th PIANC World Congress will be held in Cape Town, South Africa, in 2024.

PIANC Australia & New Zealand

PIANC Australia & New Zealand is one of the largest of the 28 National Sections within PIANC, with a growing membership of 80 corporate members and 136 individuals (including 28 students).

Our core purpose is to provide leadership in the field of waterborne transport infrastructure to advance the communities, economies and environments in Australia and New Zealand.

What we do to fulfil our core purpose:

- Share industry knowledge and best practices through local, national and regional events, including the biennial Coasts and Ports Conference - the pre-eminent forum for professionals to discuss multi-disciplinary issues related to coasts and ports.
- Promote PIANC Technical Reports and other publications, and actively contribute our knowledge and experience for their development.
- Work with government and other industry bodies to positively influence policy and provide guidance relating to waterborne transport infrastructure in our region.
- Nominate and support PIANC Australia & New Zealand members to join relevant PIANC Working Groups.
- Support the next generation of professionals in our industry by providing education and guidance which fills the gap beyond academic studies.
- Create opportunities for young professionals to meet and network with the broader industry.
- Represent the interests of our members with PIANC HQ and provide representation on relevant PIANC Commissions.

PIANC A&NZ members continued to participate strongly in PIANC's International Working Groups, and in international initiatives such as the COP 26

This Report is a testimony to the PIANC A&NZ community's continuing resilience, enthusiasm, and commitment to our shared goals and aims, despite the pandemic disruptions of 2021.

While our flagship event the Coasts and Ports Conference had to be rescheduled to 2022, we continued to support and engage our membership in 2021 through the amazing work of regional chapters. Between them they organised twenty-one technical and networking events, in person, online, or hybrid, including our first women's networking event. Note that three technical webinars are now available on our YouTube channel.

In 2021 the Board began the process of aligning PIANC A&NZ activities and processes with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), undertook a major review of our Constitution (Rules and Regulations), explored options for a higher return investment strategy, and prepared the ground for a new paid part-time position of EO to the Board.

Our highly regarded Mentoring Program continued in 2021, and again had overwhelmingly positive responses from participants. One sad note was the sudden passing in September of one of the mentors, MarCom national representative and founding Board member, Peter Fountain. PIANC A&NZ has lost a great engineer, leader and guide.

PIANC A&NZ members continued to participate strongly in PIANC's International Working Groups, and in international initiatives such as the COP 26 two day workshop on 'Practical climate change adaptation challenges and good practice solutions for ports',

Many thanks to all involved, especially to our hardworking Working Group appointments, Young Professionals and Regional Chapter members. And of course to our members, none of this could be achieved without your continual support and engagement.

PETER FOUNTAIN



The PIANC A&NZ Board and community was enormously saddened by the unexpected passing of maritime industry legend and leader Peter Fountain on Monday 6 September 2021.

Peter, an experienced maritime engineer, who led the Maunsell /AECOM maritime engineering practice in Australia for decades, had been our national representative for PIANC's international Maritime Commission (MarCom) since 2014. Prior to taking up this role, Peter had served on the PIANC A&NZ Board from its inception in 1998 to 2014.

As our region's lead for MarCom, Peter was responsible for identifying and guiding experienced and emerging Australian and New Zealand leaders in the sector to take up their place within the global ports and maritime community, joining PIANC's Working Groups to share their expertise with and learn from the world's best.

During his professional working life with the multinational infrastructure engineering company Maunsell/AECOM, (1984 – 2019) Peter was instrumental in the delivery of major port and marine projects in every state of Australia, and in delivering over 50 major port and marine projects globally, including in PNG, Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, New Caledonia, India, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Hong Kong, Vietnam, Dubai, Saudi Arabia, South Africa and Guinea.

PIANC A&NZ Commission Lead Greg Britton recalled, "Peter had a stellar reputation in the maritime engineering industry, enormously respected for his experience and knowledge. More than that, over the many years I knew Peter, he was always humble, generous with his time, and willing to share his knowledge and guide others. His passing is a very sad loss."

From your friends and colleagues at PIANC A&NZ, we are grateful for your life and work with us Peter. Thank you for sharing your talents, expertise, wisdom, and kindness with us.

As a mark of respect and gratitude PIANC International has dedicated the new MarCom WG 24O - Guidance for Ports in Small Island Countries - to Peter's memory.



In 2021 the PIANC A&NZ Board embarked on a process to align PIANC A&NZ with a common framework for sustainability, led by Board Member Jackie Spiteri with the support of 2021 Board Observer Anna Gudkov.

Of the eight SDGs identified, four have been prioritised to identify where PIANC A&NZ can make the greatest impact. These are SDG4 - Quality Education, SDG9 - Industry Innovation and Infrastructure, SDG 13 - Climate Change, and SDG 17 - Partnerships for the Goals.




The Cairns Shipping Development Project - December 2021

ABOUT ENVICOM WG 195

Ecosystem services (ES) are defined as the benefits people obtain from the environment and its ecosystems. The ES concept provides a framework for evaluating the costs and benefits of natural resource management. It can be used to evaluate, justify, or optimise decisions on how land and waterscapes are managed, for a range of sectors, including the waterborne transport infrastructure (WTI) sector.

EnviCom Working Group Report 195 – 'An Introduction to Applying Ecosystem Services for Waterborne Transport Infrastructure Projects' is a basic introduction into the understanding and the application of the ES concept in WTI projects. It illustrates how the application of ES concepts may benefit the day-to-day work of WTI designers, planners, operators, and managers.


Congratulations to all involved in WG208 including PIANC A&NZ contributors Carsten Varming and Tom Condie (YP Member).


